



English

Children will study 5 books this term and we will use them to develop their reading and writing skills

The Egyptian Cinderella—In this unit children write to inform, producing a newspaper report based on the story.

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory—Children produce writing to both entertain and persuade. They write a persuasive letter and a character description.

Where the Wild Things Are—Children write their own adventure stories based on this book.

The Proudest Blue—The children write a letter to inform based on the book.

The Tunnel— Children produce a short story using this picture book as a stimulus.

Maths



Multiplication and Division

Children consolidate their knowledge and understanding of the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. They solve problems involving multiplication and division. They learn how to multiply and divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.

Length and Perimeter

Children measure, compare, add and subtract lengths in millimetres, centimetres and metres. They use their skills to measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes.

Fractions

Children learn to recognise, find and write fractions of objects. They add and subtract fractions.

Across all areas, children use a variety of learning approaches in maths including a daily arithmetic session; interactive games; practical and written work. The focus is very much on securing quick recall of number bonds multiplication and related division facts.

Science

Animals Including Humans

During this topic the children investigate the human skeleton and learn the names of the major bones in the body. They learn about how animals and humans gain nutrition from food and the basics of the food chain.

RE

Galilee to Jerusalem



In this branch, children experience the ministry of Jesus, the Word of God. They learn about the life of Jesus and his revelation of the kingdom of God through parables, encounters, miracles and teachings.

Desert to Garden

Children study the season of Lent and its culmination in the events of Holy Week. Children look at the liturgical journey from the desert of Lent to the garden of Resurrection, but also to the Paschal journey from darkness to light, barrenness to fruitfulness, death to life.

Catholic Social Teaching

Children learn about how to build a community.



History

Who were the Ancient Egyptians?

The children begin by deciding upon questions they would like to investigate about Ancient Egypt and they draw on previous historical skills to discuss how they will find out answers. They use a range of sources of evidence including books, images and artefacts to find out about what life was like in Ancient Egypt and they present their finding in a variety of ways including the use of multimedia. The children also learn about pharaoh masks, including the colours and materials that they were made from and why.

Geography



Fieldwork: Map Creators

The children develop their mapping skills in this unit of work. They take part in orienteering sessions around the school grounds and learn how to map-read using a compass. They work on four figure grid references. They create a treasure hunt for year 2 children providing them with maps and clues to follow. The maps have basic grid references and identify north, south, east and west. They work in teams to plot a trail for year 2 and then support them to complete the treasure hunt.

PE



Gymnastics- Children will be physically confident in using of a variety of gymnastic skills and linking gymnastic actions together in a flowing movement.

Attack and Defend- Children compete in individual activities and team games to develop an understanding of attacking and defending principles, as well as improving their resilience and determination.

Paralympics-Children understand difficulties faced by people living with a disability and learn the value of respect.

Computing



Programming– Sequencing Sounds

This unit introduces children to programming. Children are introduced to a selection of motion, sound, and event blocks which they use to create their own programs, featuring sequences.

Data and Information– Branching Databases

Children develop their understanding of what a branching database is and how to create one. They use yes/no questions to gain an understanding of what attributes are and how to use them to sort groups of objects. They create physical and on-screen branching databases.



Art

Self Portrait– Van Gogh

During this topic the children are introduced to Vincent Van Gogh and research his work and style. Using sketch books, they aim to imitate his style and build up the skills required to paint in the style of Van Gogh.

Music

This term the children work with Alfa Music Service. They continue to develop their Year 3 musical understanding. They learn the 'Clap, Tap, Click' which helps them to play as part of an ensemble using and transferring rhythmic patterns as a compositional device.

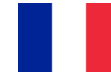


D&T

Textiles—Spring Card

The children design and create a unique 'textile' Easter card. They investigate a collection of fabric style greeting cards and explore the stitches, fabrics finishing techniques etc. They design their card by sketching and annotating a range of possible ideas. Children practise the stitching and joining skills required before making their final product. They evaluate the final product in relation to the design brief and criteria.

French



The children learn the days of the weeks and the months of the year. They further their previous learning by counting to 30. The children explore the names of foods and how to use verbs. They practice how to ask and answer

Dreams and Goals-

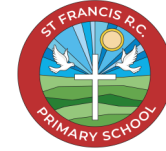
